Choose the right template for your table cover we have 6ft and 8ft table covers 3 sided and 4 sided. Make sure to choose the right one for your project.

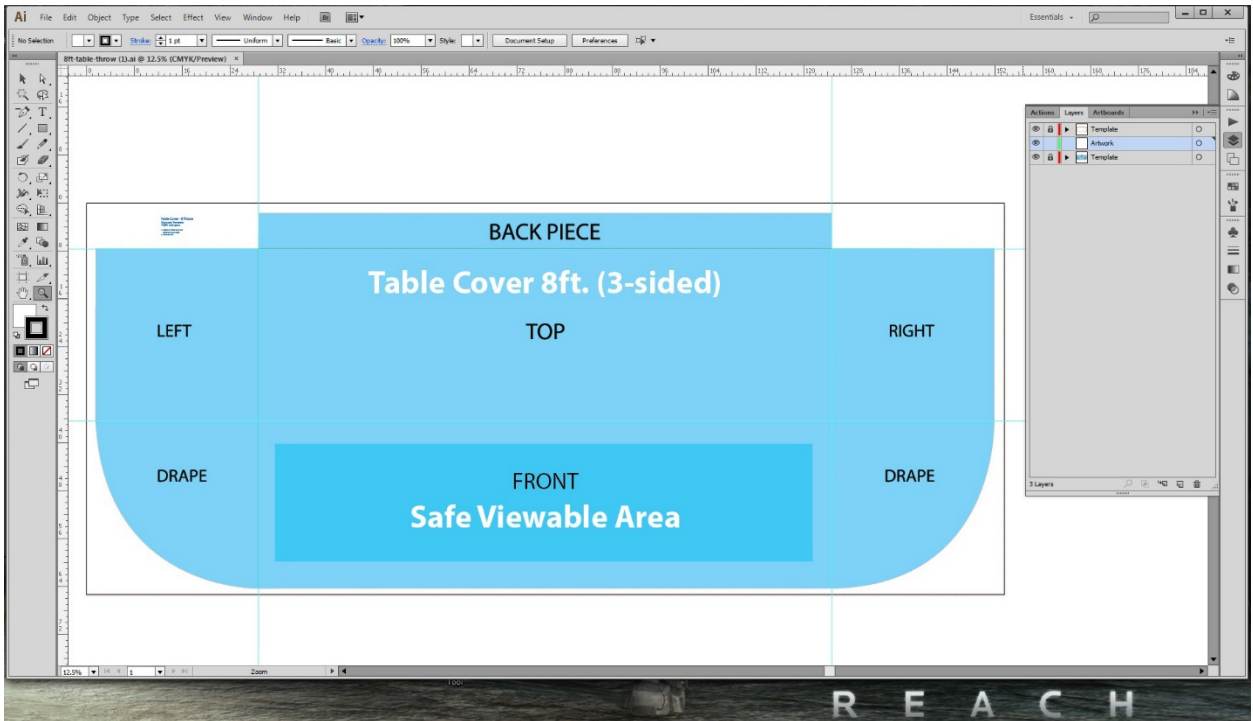
Choose the program (software) you'll use to put together your file. We offer templates for 3 major programs (Adobe Photoshop, Adobe Illustrator and Corel Draw)

In Adobe Illustrator

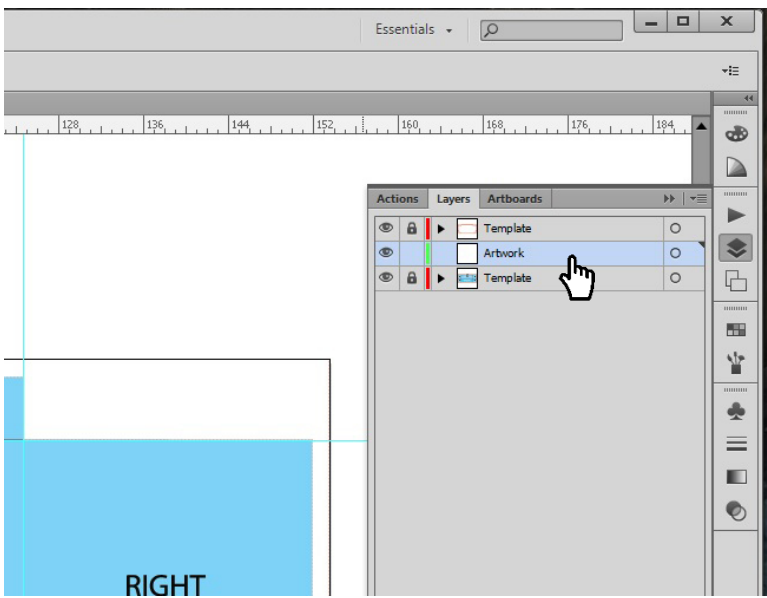
1. Download the Illustrator template by right clicking on the template's name and clicking on "Save link as" and saving the template to the desktop or folder of your choice.

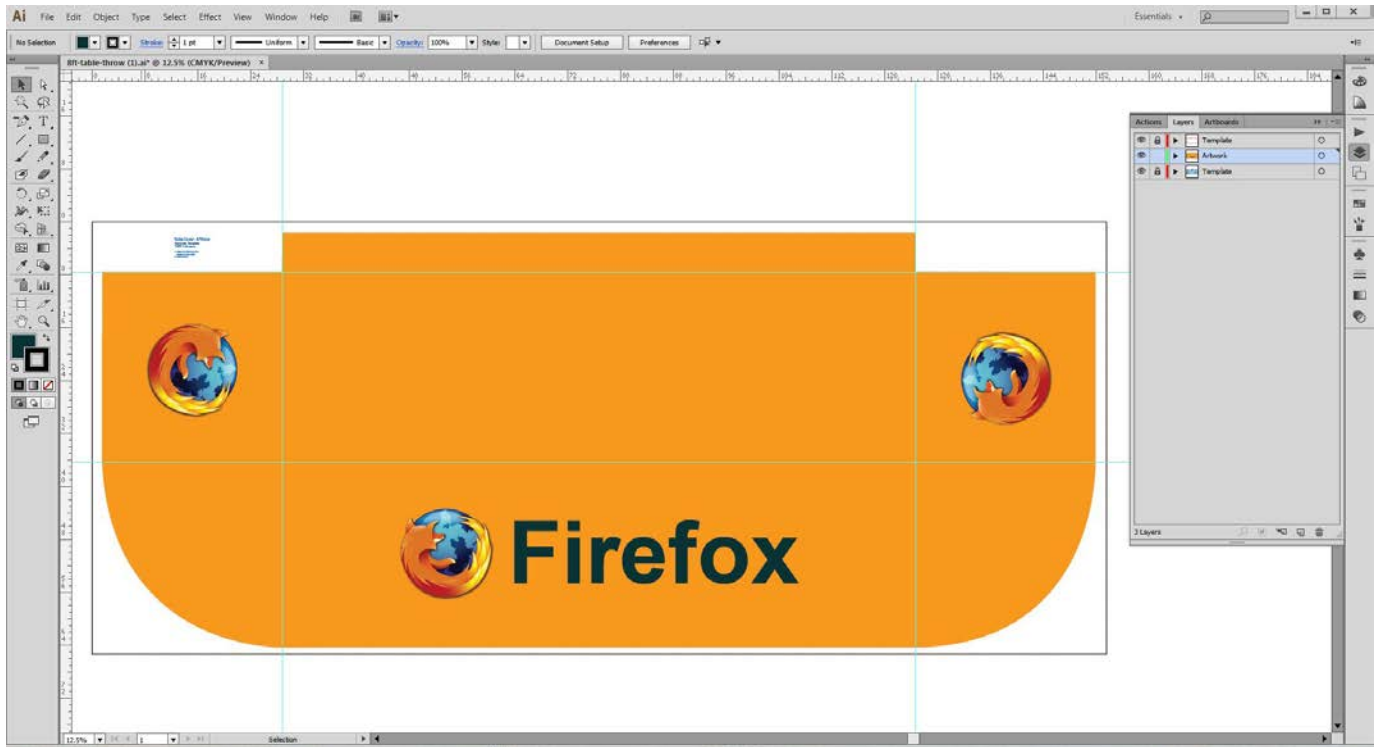

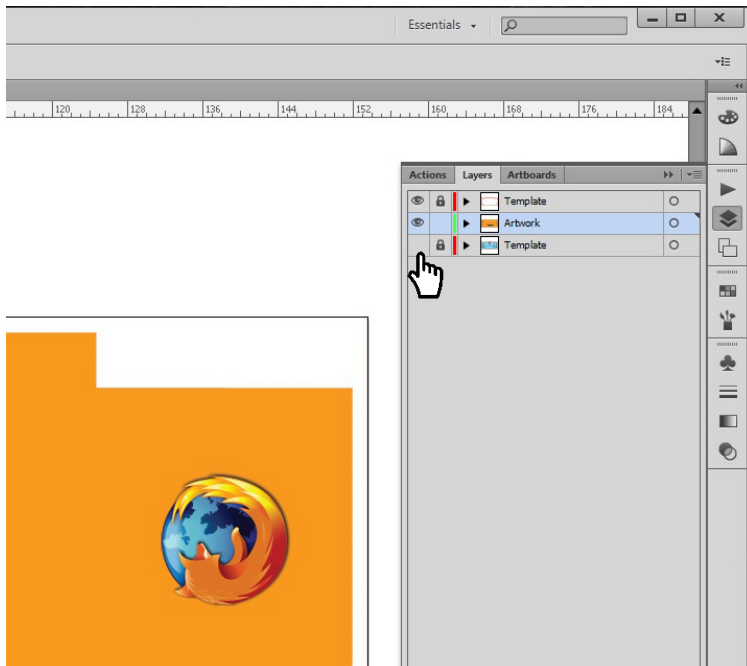
3. Open the Layers Menu and Select the Artwork Here Layer



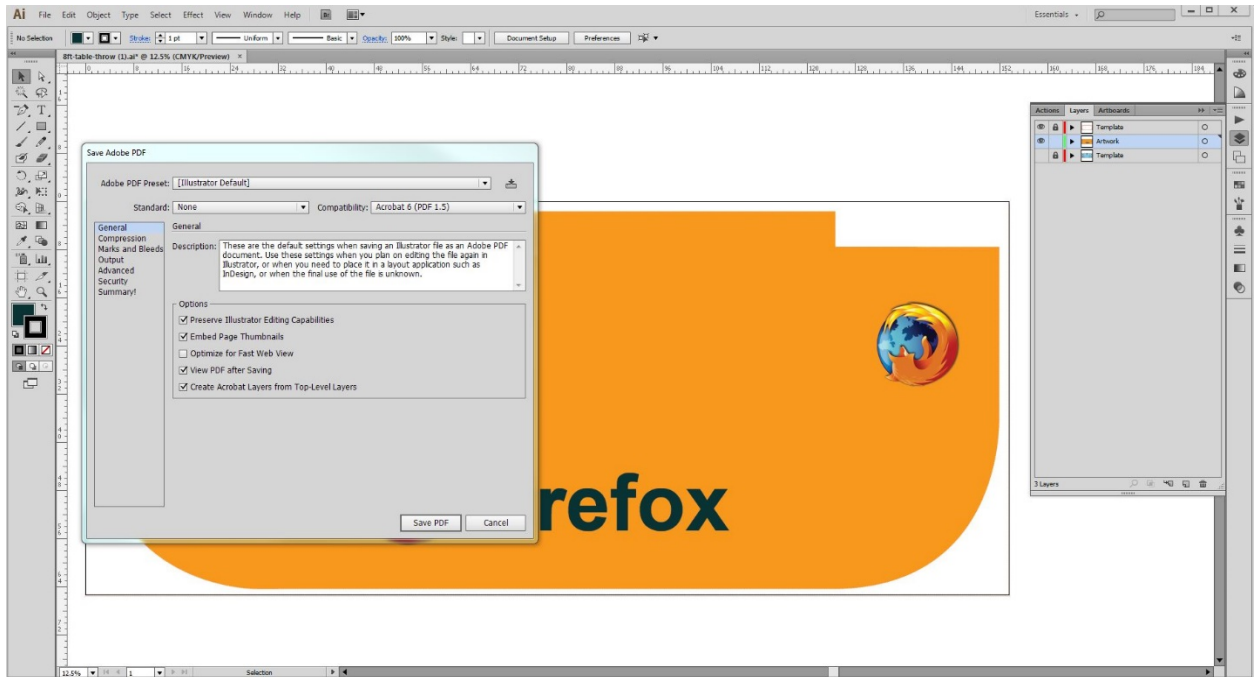
4. Add your artwork

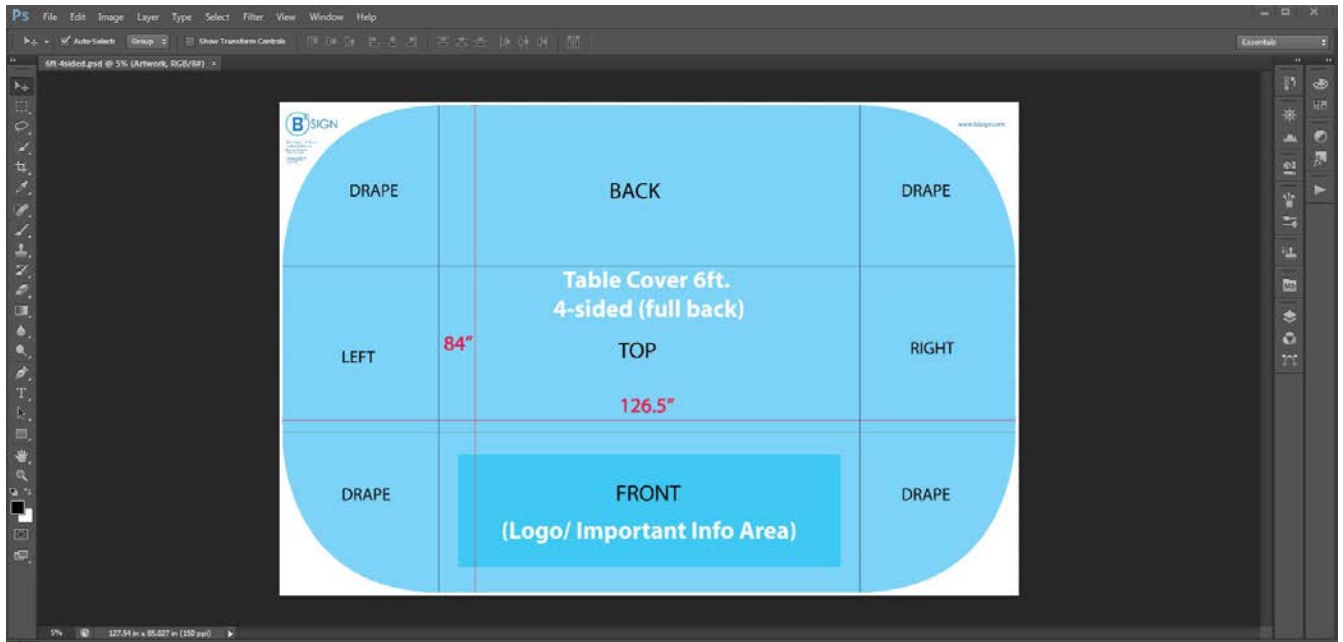


In Photoshop

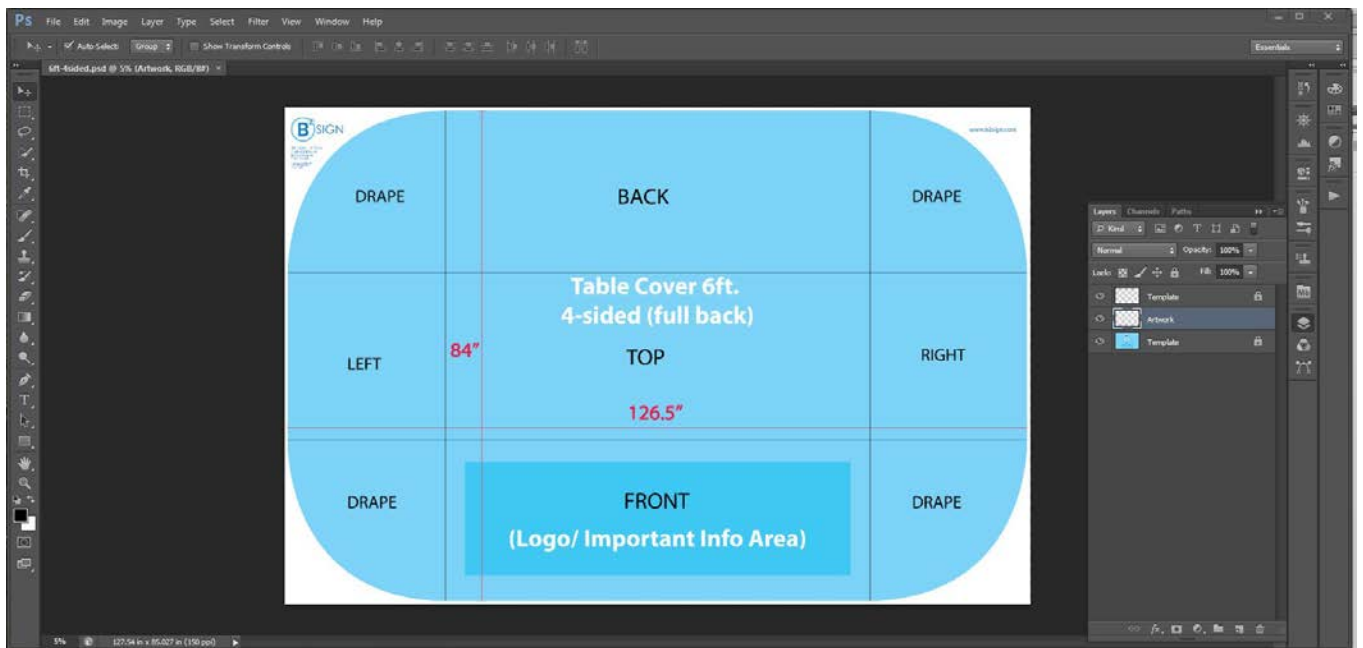

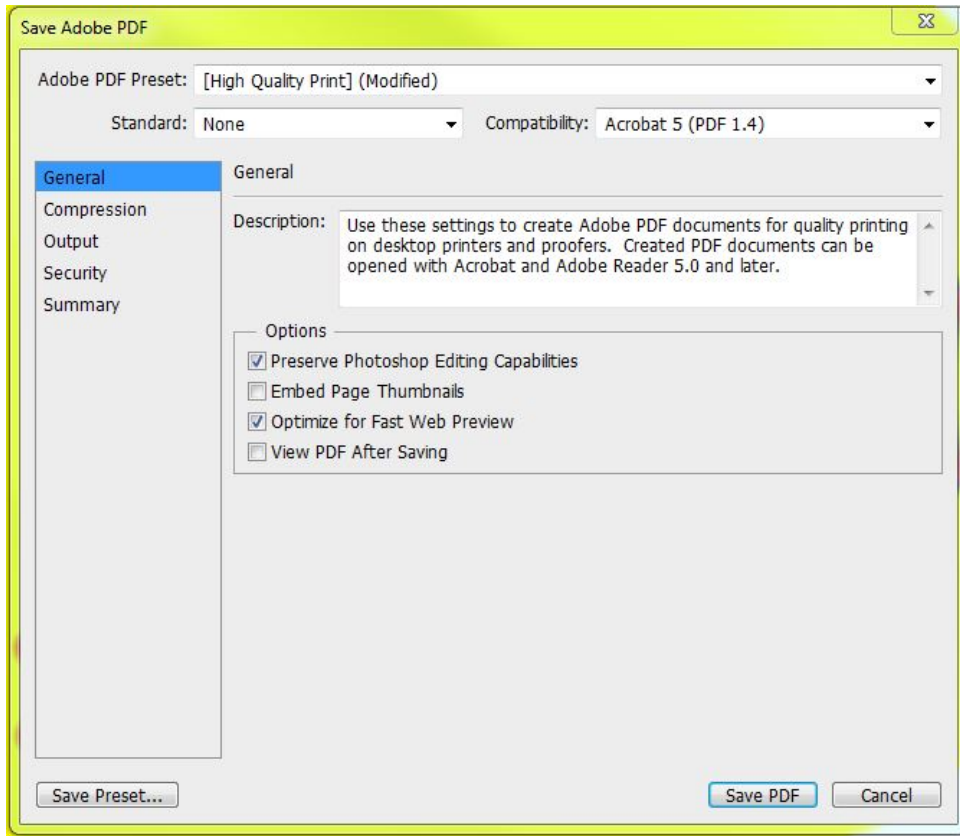

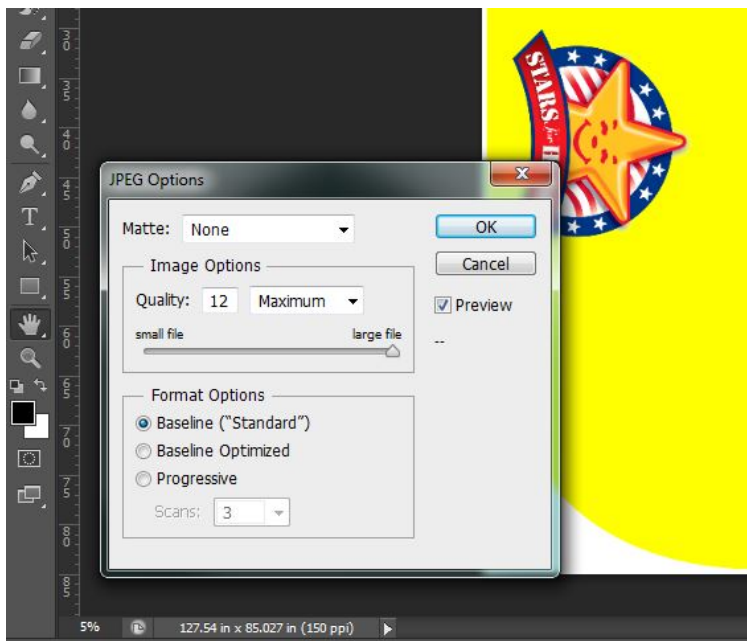

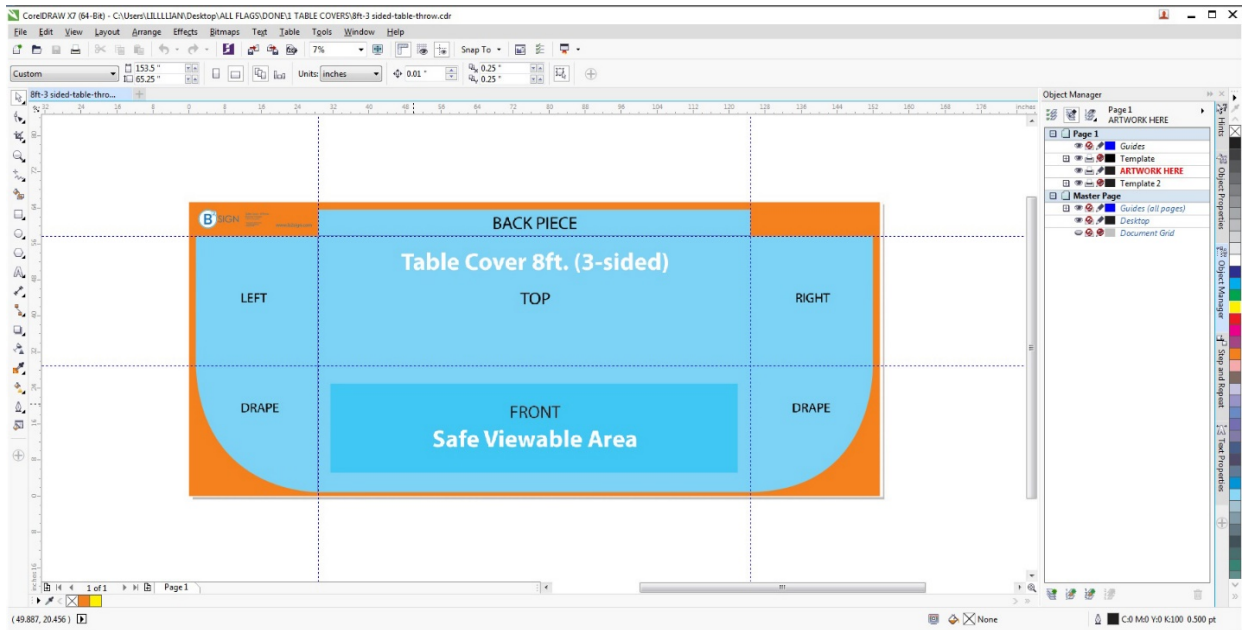

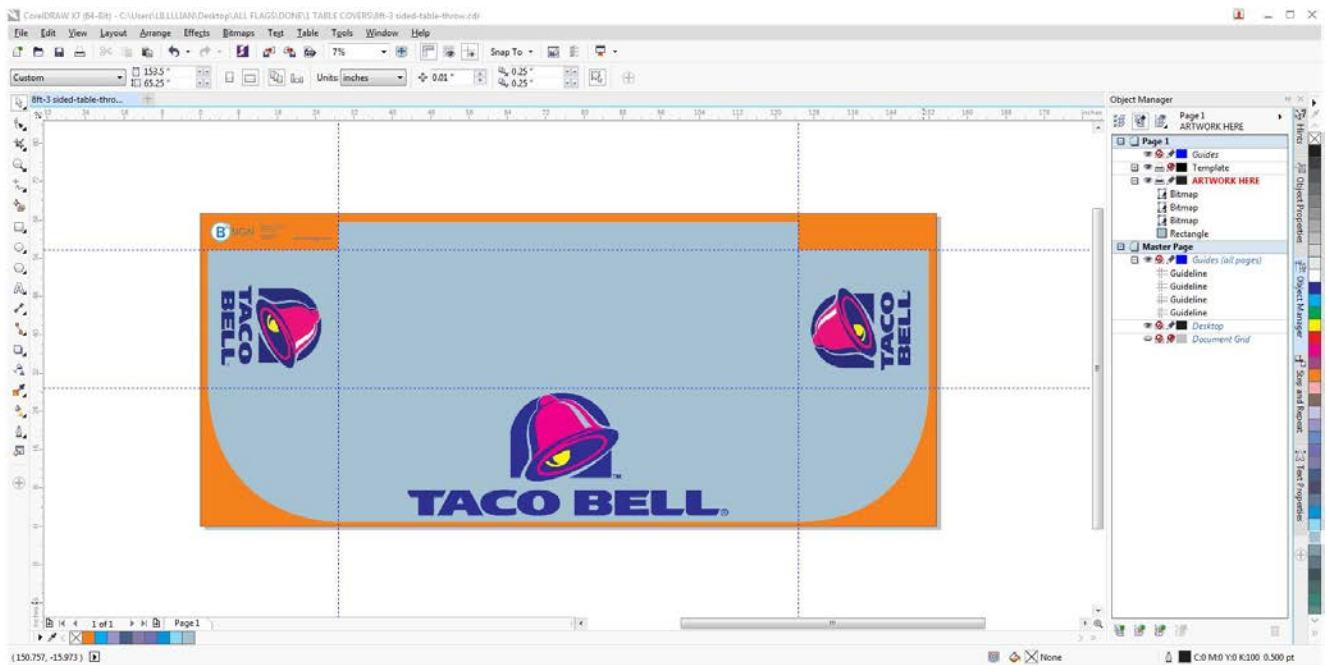
3. Open the Tools Menu and Select Object Manager to see the Layers



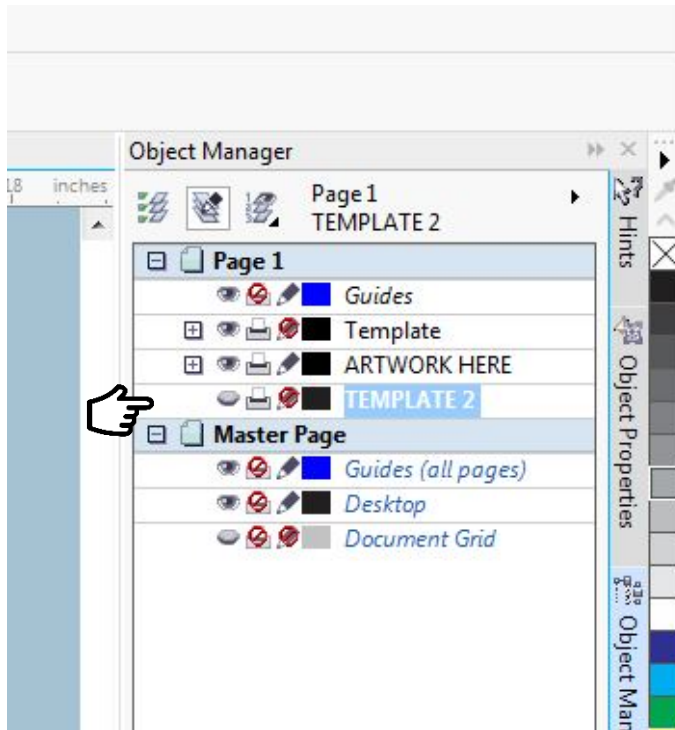
4. Select "Artwork Here" Layer



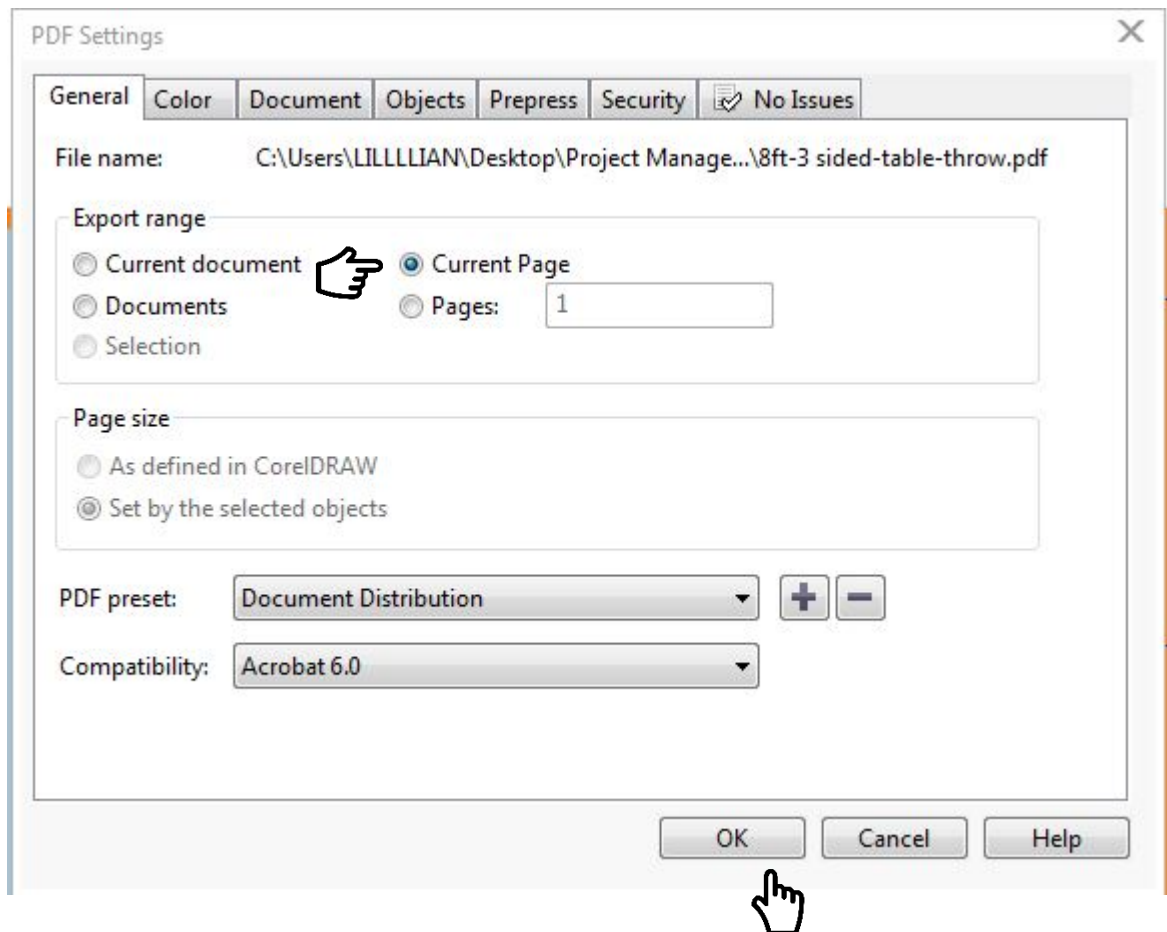
5. Add Your artwork
